The Government believes that we need to take action to safeguard our national security at home and abroad. We also recognise that we need to do much more to ensure that our Armed Forces have the support they need, and that veterans and their families are treated with the dignity that they deserve. We will maintain Britain's nuclear deterrent, and have agreed that the renewal of Trident should be scrutinised to ensure value for money. Liberal Democrats will continue to make the case for alternatives. We will immediately play a strong role in the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty Review Conference, and press for continued progress on multilateral disarmament.

 We will work to rebuild the Military Covenant by:

 ensuring that Service personnel's rest and recuperation leave can be maximised;

 changing the rules so that Service personnel only have to register once on the Service register;

 exploring the potential for including Service children as part of our proposals for a pupil premium;

 scholarships for the children of Servicemen and women who have been killed on active duty since 1990;

 providing support for ex-Service personnel to study at university.

 We will double the operational allowance for Armed Forces personnel serving in Afghanistan, and include Armed Forces pay in our plans for a fair pay review.

 We will look at whether there is scope to refurbish Armed Forces' accommodation from efficiencies within the Ministry of Defence.
